

I am creating an email template that allows people to toggle the amount of text that will be included in each row (during the loop) I have used a rich text widget with the parameter "unique_in_loop"

While this successfully gave me the unique rich text area for each, when someone goes to the edit modules menu, the order of the labels for the content rows are reversed

Likewise, is it possible to add dynamic text into the "label" of the modules? for example using a set variable in the name like

label=Label Number {loop.index}

Hi AJ,

First, thank you for documenting this so well. It really allowed me to dig right into it. I see exactly what you're referring to. Normally questions of this nature are best fielded on the Designers Forum as while a response may not be as timely there (it can take a few days before the community gets back to you) ultimately given that designers both from HubSpot and externally weigh in they are able to dig in with much more technical depth and work with specific code examples.

There currently isn't a way to add dynamic text into the label of the modules. I can certainly see how that would be extremely useful here especially as you're creating a repeater module. I took a look at the way you've built this out in your test template and I'm not sure if it's the same as the above-linked repeater module outlines. If it isn't it may be worth trying out that code to see if the order appears correctly. If it doesn't then the best way forward here will be to take that example and build out a post on the designers forum that outlines how even when built according to the repeater module outlined in our documentation the added posts are listed in reverse order. This will allow my developers to work with you directly in evaluating and addressing this at that point.

Please let me know if any of that needs clarification AJ.

Hi AJ,

Thanks for building that out. I'm still seeing the same thing you're outlining here. I'm going to reach out to my development team and kick this conversation off with them internally. If you wouldn't mind keeping that test email around I'll use it as an example. I can't guarantee when I'll be able to get back to you around this as it will involve a few people getting involved, however as of right now I've got everything I need here to accurately communicate this (and your perspective on this) internally.

Sounds good. Ill leave it open.

Also, one more thing to look into is being able to output/select the variable that is using a unique_in_loop from a module inside of a loop. For example:

```
{% for item in items %}
```

{% choice "choice" label="this is a choice" choices="1,2,3" unique_in_loop=Item

This will loop through the items and allow a choice to be given for each iteration of the loop. The only issue with this is it will only output the value of the first iteration ({{ widget_data.choice value }}) every time and not the value of the CURRENT iteration. Having this ability would greatly benefit developers in creating complex layouts such as letting a user define a number of rows and then inside each row generated, given them the ability to configure more (the number of columns). Perhaps a {{ loop.widget_data.choice value }} to grab the value from the current iteration of the module.

Right now the only work around for this is to not use a FOR loop to generate all the items and instead hardcode it all with a giant (literally a very long chunk of code) IF statement.

I've also shared our suggestions for improvements to this functionality. To be really up front it is possible that changes will not be made to how modules are currently pinned to the page. I'm still making sure that the perspective you've brought to the table is being communicated internally, and the discussion isn't over, however I wanted to be clear about this possibility.
